

The boat's body is built out of lightweight carbon fiber, which is as strong as metal but much lighter.




ZR48 cockpit is pure Corvette

After entering through custom gull wing doors, the driver is treated to a true Corvette cockpit, complete with an original shifter and steering wheel. If you feel like enjoying some quality programming while cruising the open sea, you can switch on the built-in LCD displays which come complete with and a mobile wifi hotspot.














Senior Driving
